Thank you for registering as a participant in the Centenary Celebration of Scouting! This is your introduction to participating in the event May 4-6, 2007 at the Ross County Fair Grounds near Chillicothe, Ohio.

Where: The Ross County fairgrounds are located at the junction of Ohio Route 207 and Route 104 north of Chillicothe, Ohio.

When: Registered campers may check-in and set-up between 1:00 PM and 9:00 PM Friday, May 4, 2007. One vehicle may enter the camping area at a time. All additional vehicles must park in the main parking area (several hundred yards away). Unit trailers are permitted in the camping area, however all vehicles must exit the camping area by 9:00 PM Friday.

Camp set-up may be completed in advance per the following schedule:

Camp break-down: After 11:00 AM, Sunday, May 6, 2007. Campgrounds must be vacated and policed by 4:00 PM, Sunday.

Security: The Ross County Fairgrounds are reasonably secure (fenced and gated) but we can offer no guarantee of security for items left unattended.

Camp fires: Camp fires are strongly discouraged. All open fires must be arranged in advance and scheduled for pre-ignition inspection by Union Township fire inspectors (inspections are required by the Union Township Fire Chief to ensure regulatory compliance).

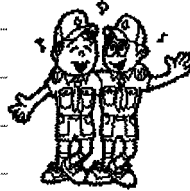

Let the Fun Fair BEGIN! Acting Up Recycleville

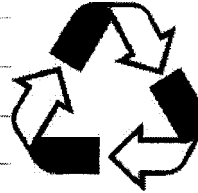

You can do your duty and use your imagination to help create our town "Recycleville", by bringing clean, dry plastic recyclable containers from home.

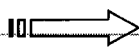

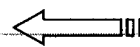

Earn your service rocker!

Community service is a cornerstone of Scouting.

We are celebrating 100 years of Scouting service to our communities and our country by offering Chillicothe and Ross County our help during our event. To earn your service rocker you must sign up and participate in one of many service opportunities offered through the event. These opportunities will be filled on a first come—first served basis. Most projects will require leaving the event-grounds for a maximum two-hour service rotation. Projects will be assigned to units, and units must provide two-deep leadership and transportation. Maps and descriptions will be provided (we are requesting transportation assistance from the local community as well).

PROJECTS

Tree planting project: 1000+ seedlings will be planted along the fencerow of the nearby Route 207 right-of-way during the event (many units will walk from the event to the tree planting—some must drive). Rubber-bottom boots (muddy in places) and gloves are recommended.

Community trail beautification project: 7.5 miles of urban and rural trail will be cleaned-up by many units. Sturdy boots and gloves are needed.

Urban wetlands beautification project: Two large wetlands will be cleaned-up. Rubber boots and work gloves are required!

City beautification project: Scouts will clean-up litter in Chillicothe's downtown district.

Social services projects: Units will visit local facilities serving the community. Clean full uniform, please! Scouts will visit the elderly, and help community groups serve the community. Limited opportunities.

Event Workshop projects: We will set up a workshop to assemble bird and bat houses for use in the community parks and beyond. This project is reserved for event participants with special needs, or special skills.
